You MUST have your photo ID with you to check-in for EVERY shift or free shows!

If you are under 18 you MUST bring your parental slip to your first volunteer shift.

You are expected to follow the Volunteer Code Code of Conduct.

Be on time for EVERY shift. We suggest you aim to be 15 minutes early.

PLEASE inform your Crew Leader ASAP if you are unable to attend your shift or are unable to perform the duties required during your shift.
